Learning to Ring – Another Reason Why

People learn to ring for all kinds of reasons and at different times in their lives.

One of our teenage learners saw my article about ringing in the Shalford Magazine last December and he turned up to our next practice thinking it would be a fun and unusual evening activity.

Will had already enrolled on the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme, for which he did music. He told me that his mum had suggested that he made bellringing his subject for the skills section of the Gold Award. For this, the candidate has "to show development of practical social or personal skills over a set period of time, averaging at least one hour a week."

Having started in December, with several weeks of one-to one bell handling practice under Sally's expert tuition, before our usual Monday practice began, Will has progressed from ringing a bell unaided through ringing rounds on six and eight bells to call changes. Earlier this month, he took part in ringing 'plain hunt' which is the simplest bell ringing method. It was a very good first effort, and just to prove it, he rang it again later in the practice.

I asked Will what he found the hardest thing about learning to ring. He told me that it was concentrating on the timing and how to pull the rope correctly, which can take several weeks to learn. He summed it up by saying that the technique was easy to learn but hard to master. Incidentally, he said that the easiest things were the first pull and the last pull – I think I could relate to that too! Now Will is joins the rest of the band for service ringing on Sunday mornings, which means he has to wake up early, however he sees it as an opportunity to do something for the local community.

He told me that what he liked most about learning to ring was meeting people of all ages and from different walks of life which he found very interesting and unusual because most of his out of school activities are with his own peer group. Will has now come to the end of his DofE programme, but he's very keen to carry on ringing.

Some of you might have noticed the 'Learn the Ropes' banner outside the church recently.

Now all our learners, Sarah Richard and Will are progressing well and past the bell-handling stage, we do have space for complete beginners to join the band.

Shalford Peasmarsh and Chilworth Community Council

Shalford War Memorial: after a very long wait we are pleased to confirm that we now have planning approval to rebuild the war memorial. The memorial will be rebuilt to the same design as the original memorial and with the full engraving of names around the base. This is something that had become so worn it was no longer possible to read, and we were unable to recut the stone because of its age and condition. We will start making the necessary preparations for this work with our contractor who will first need to source a suitable amount of stone. We hope that the repairs and renewed parts of the memorial will provide a fitting tribute for the next 100 years at least.

Neighbourhood Planning: planning matters never seem to be far from news headlines at the moment, with all the problems associated with finding the right amount of land in the right places to increase housing in particular, and all the necessary infrastructure and support that goes with such development. Guildford BC has a Local Plan approved in 2019 for its supply of land and target numbers for new building of all types. It is possible for local parishes and communities to have some influence on their own local area by producing a Neighbourhood Plan. This can focus of a wider range of things than just housebuilding numbers It can help to: choose where new homes, shops and offices are built; influence how new buildings look; help shape the design and uses of open spaces; grant planning permission for developments residents want. Once Neighbourhood Plan policies pass a referendum, they become part of the borough Development Plan. This means they'll be used to help decide on planning applications, although cannot prevent developments necessary to meet Guildford Borough's current and future needs. There is a considerable amount of work needed to produce a Neighbourhood Plan, with the bulk of input coming from residents, rather than the Community Council. We would be here to support the process. We would like to know if this something that local residents would be interested in doing. 

Shalford Places The Street to Kings Road

'The Street' was originally just the row of cottages beside the church, the hub of the medieval village of West Shalford. Seven cottages stood there in Tudor times, the homes of craftsmen and husbandmen. Over the centuries they became much extended and subdivided, many occupied by workers on the Godwin–Austen estate.

Dagden Road, built in the 1930s, takes its name from Dagley, Dagden or Dagwell Lane which runs behind it down to the Common. Dagley Lane was the main route in the Middle Ages from West Shalford to the river crossing at Broadford. There was no bridge at Broadford until the beginning of the nineteenth century.

Orchard Road is well-named, built on a former orchard, part of Shalford Farm that belonged to Whitnorth (the house on the main road with the pillars on the pavement) in the eighteenth century. When Guildford Borough extended Tillingbourne Road in the 1950s they missed an opportunity to call the new development Horsecrofts, the name of twelve acres or so of fields there for half a millennium at least. Maybe Shalford was a centre of horse breeding in the Middle Ages.

Also part of Shalford Farm was Path Field, a seven-acre field now covered by Tillingbourne Road, Florida Road, the railway and Station Road. The eponymous path led to the Common and was given a kink and a diversion when the railway came, but still exists, crossing the railway and Station Road before emerging onto Kings Road. In 1886 builder Edward Mitchell bought land to create Station Road and built himself a large house called Pathfield. After his death the Atherton family lived at Pathfield. Mitchells Close and Atherton Close stand on the site of Mitchell's builder's yard. Weald Close is built where Pathfield stood: why isn't it called Pathfield Close?

The main route to Wonersh was along Chinthust Lane which before the railway came in 1849 branched from the main road just in front of Station Row. Kings Road was just a track across the Common. It acquired its name in the early 1900s,

perhaps in honour of Edward VII who came to the throne in 1901 and because, like now, it seemed a novelty to have a king after a longreigning queen.

SHALFORD AUTUMN CLUB

The Club is now following its winter schedule of one meeting a month from October to March. Our AGM was held at the October meeting, followed by a short Bingo session. We also look forward to hearing about a section of restored canal with new bridges and footpaths at Birtley, just south of Bramley, which was formally opened in a ceremony held last month. As always, visitors will be most welcome to join us for this talk (free of charge) on Tuesday 27 February 2024, at 1.30 for 1.45pm in the Tillingbourne Room at Shalford Village Hall.

Looking ahead to the rest of next year's programme, there will be three more talks on places of local interest: 'Surrey Gardens', 'Tales of a Loseley Guide', and 'Guildford Personalities' and, travelling further afield, a journey along the Desert Highway in Jordan. As a change from sightseeing, there will also a session about the various types of bees and how to attract them into the garden and, we hope, a visit from a puppy in the first stage of training as a Guide Dog for the Blind. 


